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Frequently asked questions

Q. Where can I find a list of covered drugs?

A. An up-to-date, searchable list is available on our website, [Geisinger.org/EMHS](https://www.Geisinger.org/EMHS). Click the “Covered Drugs” link.

Q. What is the free drug list?

A. This is a list of medications for chronic diseases, such as hypertension, diabetes and cholesterol, that do not have a copay. To find the list, visit [Geisinger.org/EMHS](https://www.Geisinger.org/EMHS) and click the “\$0 Copay Drug List” link.

Q. Where can I find a list of participating pharmacies?

A. An up-to-date, searchable list is available on our website. Visit [Geisinger.org/EMHS](https://www.Geisinger.org/EMHS) and click the “Pharmacy Search” link.

Q. Is prior authorization required and how does it work?

A. To ensure all medications are used appropriately, select drugs may require prior authorization. In order for a member to receive prior authorization, the prescribing physician must obtain prior authorization by completing and submitting a request form or medical documentation.

Q. Where can I find the list of drugs that require prior authorization?

A. You can use the formulary search at [Geisinger.org/EMHS](https://www.Geisinger.org/EMHS) to find drugs that require prior authorization. You may also call our customer service team at 800-988-4861 (TDD/TTY 711).
