

Preventive Health Coverage Adjustments

Effective January 1, 2019

- Men B – age 10+ per provider
- Zoster vaccine – new recombinant 2 doses for age 50+, old vaccine age 60+ if intolerant to recombinant
- BP screening – annually
- Colorectal screening – ages 45-85
- Hep B screening – age 3+ per provider
- Hep C screening – age 3+ per provider
- Labs – BMP, CMP, TSH, CBC – age 3+ per provider (may discontinue in 2020)
- Obesity screening – add counseling
- Syphilis screening – age 11+ per provider
- Breast cancer screening – annual mammogram age 40+ per provider
- Breastfeeding – provide interventions during pregnancy and after birth to support BF, including rental costs for BF equipment
- Cervical cancer screening
 - Age 21-65: Pap q3y
 - Age 30-65: HRHPV Testing +/- Pap q5y
 - Age 30+: if normal cytology (Pap), HRHPV Testing q3y (HRSA recommendation)
- Contraceptive methods and counseling – all FDA approved methods, sterilizations, procedures, and patient education per provider
- Gonorrhea – age 24 and younger if sexually active
- HIV screening – all pregnant and annually for sexually active females
- Osteoporosis – age 65+, and age <65 with increased risk of Osteoporosis based on formal clinical risk assessment tool
- Domestic violence screening and counseling – per provider
- Wellness - annually
